Annual Report and Balance Sheet, Season 1938

To the Members of the Swan Districts National Football Club
Ladies and Gentlemen—

It is with great pleasure that I present on behalf of the Management Committee your Club's Fifth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for 1938.

For the second time and in succession your Team finished Third on the Premiership List, and I feel sure that all concerned can look on season 1938 with justifiable pride.

The performance of the team throughout the Season was a record of notable achievements and your Committee desire me to congratulate them on the magnificent showing that they made in the First Semi-Final against our old fomen East Perth. They tried their hardest to win victory, and although excuses are futile, I would like to say that had Jack Murray been able to carry on in the last quarter the result may have been very different. As it was your team led at every change, 2g 5b to 2b first quarter 5g 5b to 2g 8b at half time, and 8g 11b to 5g 10b at third quarter. The clearing of Jack had been a feature of the game throughout and his loss made too large a gap in our defence. The boys however carried on in true Swan Districts never-say-die tradition, and it was a big disappointment to lose the game in the last few minutes and by the bare margin of one point only, with the final scores showing East Perth 8g 15b to Swan Districts 9g 11b.

During the season your team defeated every other team in the League at least once, and it can be truly said that the term *inferiority complex* does not apply to them.

The season as a whole was one to remember. Every club had made a special endeavour to lift the standard of the game, and I believe they were successful, as witness the larger attendances at matches and increased revenue from that source.

Your Committee made every effort to improve the team and local talent was concentrated on. In addition, they authorised your coach (Mr. Jim Ditchburn) to make planned excursions to country matches and he has been able to select quite a few promising players whom we are in touch with for next season.

A milestone in the road of progress was reached with the opening of our new grandstand and clubrooms referred to elsewhere. Then we had a visit from St. Kilda Football Club, who showed themselves to be gentlemen on and off the field, although they did not defeat our State's 2nd eighteen. The selection of our captain and coach, Jim Ditchburn, as vice-captain of the State side which played away against Victoria and South Australia, and the selection of Jack Murray, George Krepp and Spec Sinclair in the same side afforded us a great deal of pleasure, as did also the selection of the same players and in addition Andy Zilko to play against South Australia on their visit here. This latter player, with Harry Mosey and Ted Holdsworth also represented your Club with the 2nd eighteen versus St. Kilda. Congratulations to all of these players, are due, also to Jim Ditchburn on his selection as captain of the State side against South Australia. From the foregoing 1938 was a remarkable football year from every point of view.

PREMIERSHIP

To Claremont we extend our heartiest congratulations on winning the 1938 premiership. They have been building up for years and it must afford everyone pleasure to see a new team on the top of the list.

In conclusion I would like to express my thanks for the kind consideration and assistance I have received from every quarter.

He attended practically every Committee meeting also nearly every social function, not to mention Players Teas, Therefore he travels hundreds of miles a year in the interest of your Club, and your Committee feel deeply indebted to him for his bringing the team to the Final Four for the second time, and the untiring example he sets all players and Club members alike. His Second Annual Report is as follows:

To the Committee of the Swan Districts Football Club

GENTLEMEN—

In submitting to you my Second Annual Report I can confidently present to you another season of successful achievement. The team gave the lie to public fallacy that they were unable to produce their best football away from Bassendean Oval by winning more matches away than at home, despite the handicap of an unfavourable draw in the fixtures. We succeeded in breaking down the only remaining hoodoo by defeating East Perth at Loton's, for the first time in your Club's history and as well as a meritorious victory at the Port against East Fremantle we were successful in a most vital match against Perth at the WACA Ground. These performances convince me of a steady progress in our efforts at team building and with the exception of a slight period of flatness towards the close of the season we were perhaps the most reliable and consistent team in the league in a season in which club fortunes fluctuated so frequently. To have finished the season in third position for the second successive year is in itself sufficient commendation of the capability of the team. Whilst we were unsuccessful in our semi-final by one point I venture the opinion that our defeat was not through lack of ability and condition on our part.

The improvement shown by individual players was recognised by the State Selectors, who called upon five of our players to represent the State this season, all of whom worthily upheld their own and the Club's reputation. Three of these players received trophies for their play in the Interstate games.

Though very pleasing to note the improvement of first year players several of our more experienced players were guilty of unexpected lapses of form, resulting in a few of our matches being devoid of that fighting spirit for which your Club has established a reputation. In the vital matches however they all rose to the occasion magnificently.

During the season at your request I have visited several country districts and have invited some of their outstanding players to join with our club next season. These, with several local juniors whom we have kept under close observation and encouraged should be the means of eliminating the few weak links apparent in our combination. My thanks are due to your Committee for their close co-operation; to all the players who responded so well when called upon; to the trainers for their untiring attention to the players; to the property man and doorkeepers for the manner in which they carried out their onerous duties, and to all others who assisted, no matter in how small a manner to preserve the harmony in the club rooms which so materially was responsible for our success. I would also thank Drs. Kyle and Buttsworth for their interest and attention to our injured players.
