COACH'S REPORT

The Committee of the Swan Districts Football Club,
Gentlemen,

In submitting this report, I do so with a certain amount of confidence for the future of your team in the forthcoming seasons.

Knowing the calibre of your team in past seasons, I made it my mission to build your side from junior players, who possessed strong character, temperament and football ability, because a player who is not willing to learn and do as he is instructed to, is of no use to any team as he serves to create trouble.

I would like to state that it was also my policy to play this young type of player as much as possible to give him the necessary experience in his first year of League football, and I am sure with all these players available in the forthcoming seasons, your Club in general will appreciate my policy, as these players will come back into League ranks next season, with a full year of League football experience, thus having gained the necessary confidence.

During the 1952 season I would also like to point out to your Committee that we had in the team no less than eight to ten first year players, and four to six under the age of 19 years, and it was apparent with their game against West Perth in the concluding match, that these players were just gaining confidence when the season ended.

Your Club at present lacks key position players, especially a class full-forward; but I feel confident that Kevin Gale will fulfil this position, if given the opportunity, as he is most determined to learn.

I would also like to point out a few anomalies that I consider exist and if given the required attention, I feel that it will be to the advantage of our Club in general.

(1) That the League and Seconds Teams train on alternate nights, this would serve to make the Seconds player keen to get into League ranks, and also the League player keener to stop there.

(2) That the Selection Committee meet of a Sunday following the game, and select a preliminary team in their places for the following League game, this would assist the Coach in coaching the players in the positions they have been selected for.

(3) That your Club commence training about the middle of February, this would off-set the possibility of early injuries, which were so apparent in other clubs that started training late, this type of training would be known as "conditioning training".

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate our two State representatives, Duggan Anderson and Wally Sidebottom, on achieving the goal of every League footballer's ambition, in being selected for State representation.

Our Club is to be congratulated on the fine personal of all committees, and the excellent type of player and trainer that is in your Club. Would all concerned please accept my appreciation for their services.

I feel this report would not be complete without making special mention to my assistant, Jack Murray. Jack was at all times a very worthy "lieutenant".
